- 4. Congratulations to the bowling team who are the North II, Group IV State Sectional Champions. Also congratulations to Michele Dekowski who won the Female Individual Union County Tournament; best bowler in Union County.
- 5. Four wrestlers qualified for the District 11 Tournament: Javier Arredondo, Hendrix Vernot, Anthwon Pugh, and Noel Diaz.
- 6. We also have two state champions in girls winter track. Iyanna Jenkins won the Section II, Group IV State Championship in the 55 meter dash. She also qualified for the NJSIAA Meet of Champions in Toms River.
- 7. The boys' varsity basketball team is having another outstanding season. They are in the semi-finals of the Union County Tournament. They are the #1 seed in the NJSIAA State Tournament. We are currently ranked the #1 public school in the State of New Jersey.


