3. A moment of silence was observed in memory of the 17 victims of the Parkland, Florida shooting.

Dr. Robertozzi assured parents and general public that the Board and Administration is trying their best to ensure a safe and worry-free environment for our students. Safety procedures are continually reviewed; safety drills are routinely held in cooperation with the Linden Police Department with meetings held afterward to discuss what went well and what went wrong. Students are the first to recognize when something is wrong. It is our duty as adults to encourage students to tell us when something is wrong.

- 4. He spoke about the Superintendent's Report which can be found in print at the board meeting and also will be emailed to all parents.
- 5. Five years ago, when he became Superintendent, he and the board came up with a five year strategic plan. He then proceeded to read the Mission Statement.

There is a class at Linden High School called Introduction to Education for students who might be interested in a career in education. Their teacher asked them to react to the Mission Statement. Dr. Robertozzi then read several of the responses. He wanted to share the positive responses from students because that's what it's all about.

6. At this time, the Bowling and the Robotics Teams were recognized.

Dr. Robertozzi introduced the bowling team. Their first big win was the prestigious Charles A. Simon Baker Tournament. They then captured the Union County Team Championship. Sophomore Anthony Golabek placed 5th in the UCT Individual Tournament. At the North II Group III Sectional Final at Jersey Lanes, the Tigers cemented their Sectional victory by 100 pins. Freshman James Fitz also gained entry into the State Individual Final because of his 638 Series. The Tigers then completed their Watchung Conference Season as "undefeated" 17-0 against 2nd Place Union. The season was also highlighted by the breaking of the school record Series of 3,169. They scored an amazing 3,270 Series. Freshman James Fitz won the Individual High Average in the Watchung Conference at 204.48 and Anthony Golabek was right behind him at 204.29. The Tigers Finished 4th in the Group III State Finals and James Fitz finished 41st out of 80 bowlers at the State Individual Final. Dr. Robertozzi told the team that the board passed a policy a few years ago that they will receive either state championship rings or a varsity jacket.

For the past three years, we have been hosting a robotics competition at McManus Middle School. This is the first year we participated. Mr. Shehata spoke about how amazing the competition and the students were.

Teacher, Mark DeCastro then explained that this is a national, and actually, a world competition. We competed against 70 teams from all over the tri-state area. Out of 70 teams, we came in fifth place.

7. Dr. Robertozzi then introduced student Bermuda Pierre, one of the high school student ambassadors and a member of the ROTC, to make a presentation to the board. She proposed a "Wall of Honor" to honor Linden graduates, starting with last year, who have joined the military after high school graduation. She gave each board member a copy of the proposal and also gave an oral and visual presentation.

WHEREAS, on or about January 31, 2018, the parent/guardian of student # (BC); student #(EG), student #(EV) and student # (new preschooler) (collectively referred to as the "students") was notified that the students were being disenrolled from the Linden Public School District (the "District") as they were not properly domiciled within the boundaries of the District so as to entitle them to a free, public education from the Linden Board of Education (the "Board); and

WHEREAS, the parent/guardian of the students requested a hearing before the Board to address the students' residency status; and

WHEREAS, the parent/guardian was notified via email, regular mail and certified mail that the requested hearing would take place at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 22, 2018, and the parent/guardian confirmed her attendance; and

WHEREAS, the parent/guardian failed to attend the hearing and, therefore, the Board proceeded to conduct the hearing in her absence; and

WHEREAS, the Board considered the evidence presented by the Administration and determined in accordance with the Superintendent's recommendation that the students be disenrolled from the District;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that student # (BC); student #(EG), student #(EV) and student # (new preschooler) are hereby disenrolled from the Linden Public School District for lack of domicile; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Administration and Board Attorney are hereby directed to provide the parent/guardian with the necessary notices advising the parent/guardian of the disenrollment and to take the necessary actions to disenroll the students, which disenrollment shall become effective 21-days from the date notice of disenrollment is provided or until such time as the parent/guardian as exhausted all appeals.

Board Member Comments/New Business:

Mrs. Welsh wanted to give a shout out to the middle school wrestling team and their coaches, as they had an amazing year. She specifically mentioned one student, Samuel Richardson, who just began wrestling last year. He ended up with a 15-2 record this year taking first place in the Princeton Tournament as well as being Middlesex County Champion. He also took first place as a State Qualifier and will be continuing on to the State Championship on March 10th and 11th. She also mentioned her daughter Caitlin who is the middle school wrestling manager.

Mr. Martucci mentioned Soehl M.S. science teacher, Kimberly Leight, who was highlighted in tonight's Superintendent's Report. He said she was a student teacher here in Linden and when she graduated college, there were at least five other districts looking to hire her. She stayed in Linden and he is so glad she did because she is such a great science teacher.

Amanda Clayton 820 Smith Street

Ms. Clayton is a Linden High School alumnus, and in light of the Parkland shooting, wished to comment on how amazing her teachers at Linden High School were. They always made sure their students' safety was first priority. She is studying to become a teacher and will also strive to protect her students.

Jeff Gorska 1221 Mopsick Avenue

Mr. Gorska wanted to know what we are doing about gun safety in our schools and students coming from other districts that don't belong there. Dr. Robertozzi replied that what we are trying to encourage is that every child have a relationship with an adult whereby they feel comfortable enough to confide in that adult.

As far as kids coming from other districts, Dr. Robertozzi said that we do have a very aggressive attendance policy in place. We have two full time attendance officers on staff. Mr. Gorska said his concern was a student from the Alternative School who showed up at the high school and sat in class. He asked why they don't have a separate ID? Dr. Robertozzi said that is something he would look into.

James Fitz 921 Seymour

His main concern was the safety outside of school and in particular the crossing of St. Georges Avenue. Too many people try to run people over in cars. Not only that, he was also concerned about the rain, snow and ice. He was wondering if the idea of a footbridge has ever been explored. Mr. Topoleski answered that a footbridge would be much too costly; however, they are looking into several solutions that would work.

Lisa McClain

812 Monmouth Avenue

She asked what was being done to protect the students in middle school. She has heard about cameras that go directly to the police department. She was wondering if this was something that could be looked into. Dr. Robertozzi assured her that we are protecting all of our schools, not just the high school. While he cannot comment on security measures that are in place, he wanted her to know that we have an excellent relationship with the Linden Police Department and we are working on a memorandum of agreement to do something like she spoke of.

Mrs. Villani responded that as a parent of twin middle schoolers and the chairperson of the Safety Committee, she wanted everyone to know that they are looking into every aspect of safety in the entire district. She also wanted everyone to know that there are things that will not be shared with the public for security reasons.

Mary Ann Pirozzoli 829 Erudo Street

As an employee at one of our schools, she asked if the Safety Committee would consist solely of board members or could someone who actually works in the schools and sees things on a daily basis be a part of it? Mr. Topoleski replied that the committee was just formed a few days ago. If the committee would like to bring on other people, it is their right to do so. Mrs. Villani said that at some point, she believes the committee would be interested in hearing the employees' perspective. Dr. Robertozzi suggested Mrs. Pirozzoli give Mr. Delgado, LEA President, some feedback also.

Mrs. Welsh commented that as a teacher herself, it would be a good idea for the committee to reach out to staff and parents.

There being no further business to discuss, Mrs. Villani made a motion to adjourn at 8:42 p.m., seconded by Mrs. Welsh. Voice vote was unanimous.
