Comments from the Public:

Theresa Villani 225 Swarthmore Road

Stated that she has two children in the fourth grade. Came this evening to voice her opposition to the PARCC testing and the adoption of this version of Common Core.

Elizabeth Welch 903 Kent Place

Congratulated Mrs. Birch and Mr. Kolibas on their election to the Board. She then asked Dr. Robertozzi what the children would be doing who will opt out of the PARCC. Dr. Robertozzi responded that there are no planned activities. Children who do not take the test are expected to bring a book or homework, etc. to keep them occupied.

Jenny Principato 1706 Westover Road

She has heard from disgruntled parents that children are not ready for first grade due to the Tools of the Mind curriculum and wanted to know why that is. Dr. Robertozzi responded that Tools of the Mind has been used in Pre-K for at least six or seven years and has been very successful. While he was Assistant Superintendent, he met with all of the kindergarten teachers and they overwhelmingly wanted to implement Tools of the Mind. This is the second year it is being implemented in Kindergarten and at the end of this year it will be reviewed. This is the first he's heard that parents are not happy. He will get together with Mrs. Cleary and speak to the first grade teachers. If they feel the same way, adjustments will be made to the curriculum. Mrs. Cleary said that the Math Supervisor is meeting with the Early Childhood Supervisor and they are coming together on curriculum. She also asked about keyboarding instruction. Her son, who is in the sixth grade, doesn't know how to type and is on the computer for homework and wastes a lot of time. Will there be any keyboarding instruction? Dr. Robertozzi said he is definitely looking into bringing keyboarding instruction to the elementary grades, hopefully starting next year.

Lara Collado 111 Edgewood Road

Said she it was a little upsetting to see that none of the Board Members had taken the PARCC test. She urged everyone to take it. Her father is a college math professor and he was frustrated at taking the test. She wanted to know how much time her fourth grader is taking away from her studies and regular class time to concentrate on the PARCC. Dr. Robertozzi answered that the PARCC is a test which is supposed to determine what the student has learned in that grade level. Test prep is every time they're learning. She asked if an anonymous poll could be taken of the teachers to see how they felt. Dr. Robertozzi explained that we are required to give the test as a public school district; however, he respects parents' rights to have their child not take the test.
