We are, therefore, providing extra tutoring for those students.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

The Superintendent reported on the following:

• Monthly HIB report.

- He thanked the custodial and maintenance staff for digging us out from the blizzard that hit on January 23<sup>rd</sup>, under the supervision of Mr. Miranda who was out all day and all night ensuring that our schools were clear and safe for our children. As a result of the storm we have used two of our four snow days.
- The NJDOE will be visiting to observe our ESL Model Program. For the past seven years, Linden has been designated as a Model ESL Program by the NJ Department of Education.
- Sports Teams
  - The boys varsity basketball team is having a tremendous season. Their record is 12-2 and are currently ranked as the third best team in the State and the #1 public school. Their only two losses came at the hands of #2 ranked Patrick School.
  - The girls varsity basketball team had a little bit of a rough start with first year coach Mr. Fekete. They are 3-11. They are a young team without a single senior.
  - The swim team is 1-4 with a total of 28 personal records cutting off 10% of their time. This year we had the largest ever student athlete turnout for the swim team.
  - Boys winter track team is doing extremely well. Sebastian Chaquea broke the 1600 meter record; Chris Banks took first place in the 55 meter dash at the Union County Freshman Meet; Alex Tarnawski broke the sophomore school record for the 800.
  - The girls winter track team is having a phenomenal season. Iyanna Jenkins took second in the Union County Individual Championships. She's third in the 5500 hurdles, currently ranked #2, tied the school record in the 55 meter dash, and ranked #1 North Jersey, Section Two, Group Four.
  - The wrestling team has a record of 4-9. The first year coach inherited a young team, eight freshman and sophomores, who are competing against 14 starting weight classes.
  - The bowling team has a record of 9-3. James Fostinis leads the boys with an average of 212. Michelle Dekowski leads the females with 198 average. The team won the Central Jersey Winter Classic. They finished third in the Union County Tournament and four out of the five starters are competing for the Union County Tournament Individual title.
- Dr. Robertozzi commented that we are very proud of our students. He is a big proponent of extra-curricular activities, and in Linden, he believes we have something for all of our children.
