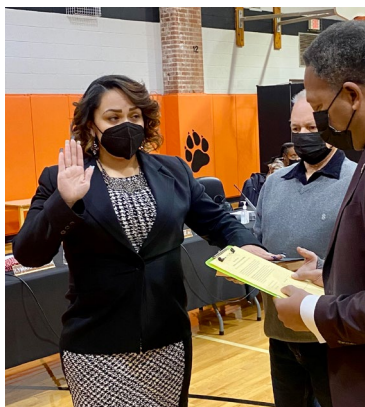

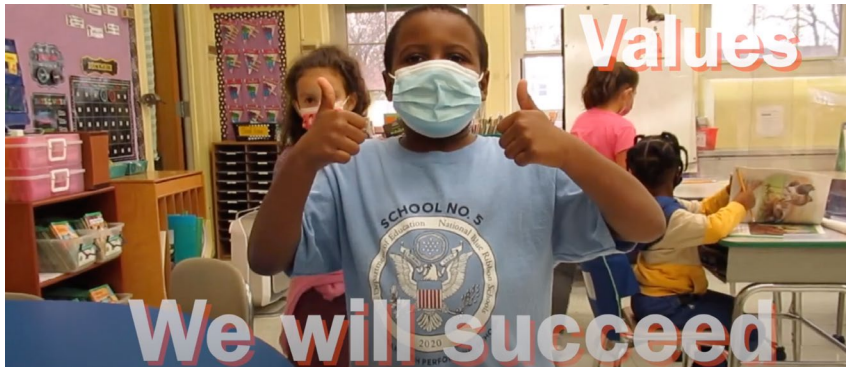
## LHS teams with Union County College for dual-enrollment classes

Linden High School is pioneering a new program along with Union County College in which students can get college credits while in high school. This dual-enrollment program allows students to get both high school and college credits

at no cost. The classes are being taught virtually by UCC instructors after the high school day has ended, and are consistent with the community college curriculum. Students will take English 101 starting in January and ending in

May. Students will take virtual classes on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 3 to 3:55 p.m. Students must be passing all their current classes at Linden High School to be eligible for the program, and space is limited to 40 students.

## Soehl VP makes connecting with students a priority

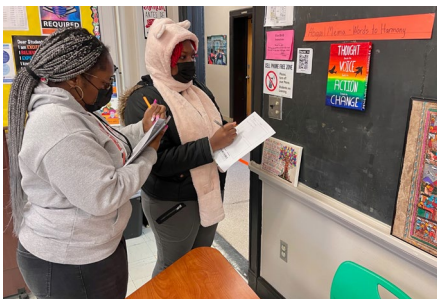

### LHS Intro to Ed students examine bias and racism

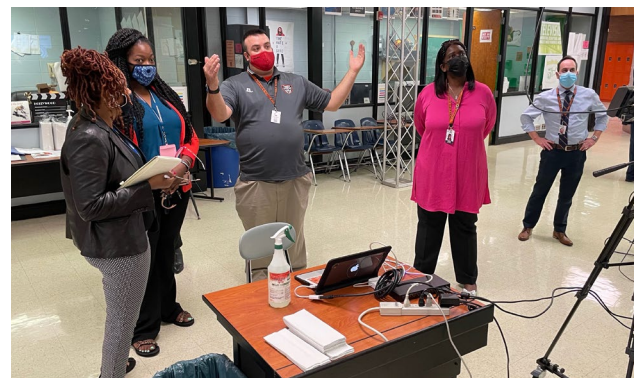

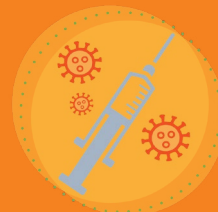
