Young inventors full STEAM ahead

Students from Schools No. 4 & 9 will test their tech skills in state competition

A group of technology students from Schools No. 4 and No. 9 have been accepted to take part in the STEAM Tank Challenge, a state competition in which students apply science and technology skills to create a product that addresses a real-world problem. The program encourages students and teachers to work collaboratively in science, technology, engineering, art, and math (STEAM). It also supports the development of critical thinking and problem-solving skills. The Linden team is made up of the Student



Vanguard technology club at School No. 4 and the fifth-grade Gifted & Talented students at School No. 9 under the guidance of technology teacher Mitch

Love of animals and MLK inspire service project



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
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SELebration continues!


Soehl has high hopes for daily newscast
