International Baccalaureate celebrating two decades at LHS

20 years of excellence

IB program gives students a head start in college and career

Linden High School is celebrating its 20th year as part of the prestigious International Baccalaureate program, an open-enrollment course of study that prepares students for college and

life after graduation with rigorous classwork alongside community service. IB is open to all juniors and seniors and allows students to earn up to a semester's worth of credits toward college at no cost upon completion. Students can select classes from six course groups: English, World Languages, History, Science, Math, and Art. All of the IB classes are free to students, unlike in some
