


#LindenFirstDay celebrates many happy returns

Career awareness gets a boost for students in middle grades

Our district has secured funding for programs to help students in Grades 5 through 8 get ready to make decisions about their futures in college and careers. The "Middle Grades Career Awareness and Exploration Grant" from the New Jersey Department of Education will bring \$68,992 into the district this school year and \$206,976 overall for the three-year term of the grant. Linden is one of just 16 districts in the state to receive the funding. The funding will allow the district to provide Saturday career and college exploration trips along with after-school clubs and organizations that promote a variety of career options.
