What Are Our Visions for the Linden Public School District?

On November 12, 2024, Linden Public School District administrators, Board of Education members, staff, parents, and community members came together for the second strategic planning meeting. The topic for the second meeting was focused on developing a vision and initiatives toward achieving that vision, for the Linden Public School District. Ms. Atiya Y. Perkins, Superintendent, introduced facilitator Jeanne Cleary, from the New Jersey School Boards Association (NJSBA), who provided an overview of the strategic planning process and the focus for the evening's activity.

We reviewed the consensus process utilized in strategic planning. The topic for the evening focused on creating a shared vision for the Linden Public School District. We were then asked to imagine — what if, in five years' time, at the maturation of the strategic plan we are creating, Linden Public Schools had become a nationally recognized school district for providing an outstanding education for its students? What if the national media was writing about the Linden Public School district so that schools nationwide could emulate what happens here?



Participants gathered in randomly assigned groups, eight groups in total, to develop a shared vision and initiatives. After group discussion, each group identified their consensus points and presented those to the larger group.

The information that follows is a summary of the work of the small groups. As discussed with the meeting participants, all consensus points are recorded and posted on the district website to share the group work during the strategic planning process.
