The Linden Public Schools firmly believe that a partnership amongst home and school is essential for student success. **ELEMENTARY SCHOOL NUMBER ONE** agrees to adopt and implement the following statutory requirements of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) as its Title I School-Based Parent Involvement Policy:

I. ELEMENTARY SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS
