Principal's Message

Greetings to our parents and families! As the new school year approaches, we would like to continue working together to provide meaningful educational opportunities to our students. It is imperative that collectively, we continue to support each other. Your cooperation with and support of all district and school policies are paramount to ensuring the health and safety of all students, faculty, and staff. With your help, we will maintain the excellence of our instructional program and continue to strive for the achievement of our students.

Emergency Contact Information

It is of the utmost importance that we have current parent/guardian and emergency contact information. If any of your information changes throughout the year, you must notify the school as soon as possible. This is the only means by which we can communicate with you at a moment's notice. An Emergency Verification Form has been sent home in the summer mailing. Please review, complete the Health Information section, make any updates directly on the form, and return it on the first day of school on **Thursday, September 7th**.

Academic Plan

All elementary students' first day of school is **Thursday**, **September 7th**, **2023**. School begins at 8:45 a.m. and concludes at 3:20 p.m. Doors will open for students eating breakfast at 8:15 a.m. Those students are to enter through Door #1. The remaining students will be granted entry into the building at 8:30 a.m. Please be aware that there is no supervision on school grounds prior to doors opening. Even in inclement weather, students will not be granted early access to the building. The district does offer a Before Care program for a fee.

Teachers and students will follow their schedules on the six-day cycle. The six-day rotation calendar will be sent home with your child, as well as their Specials schedule. Students in grades 3-5 will follow a departmentalized learning model for the core subjects. They will have a team of teachers for their core academic subjects. Whether they have two or three teachers for those subjects will depend on the total size of the grade level.

*Parents and students are encouraged to reach out to their teachers for support if needed via Class Dojo or email.

First Day Procedures

All parents will receive communication mailed home, including their child's teacher, drop-off procedures, and other pertinent information. Please note, aside from Pre-K and Kindergarten parents allowed to enter for orientation, no other parents will be granted entry into the building.

On Thursday, September 7th, **2023.** All grades 1-5 students will report to the back playground area at 8:30 a.m.

Kindergarten parents and students will line up by the Main Entrance, Door #1, at 9:00 a.m. Kindergarten Teachers will meet you and escort you to the classroom with your child for a brief orientation. After orientation, Kindergarten parents will depart and pick up their children at 3: 20 p.m. dismissal time.

Pre-K parents and students will meet at the Main Entrance Door#1 at 9:45 a.m. Teachers will greet you and escort you and your child to the classroom. Pre-K students and their parents will attend the hour orientation and be dismissed for the day. <u>Pre-K students will start their</u> school year on Friday, September 8^{th,} at 8:45 a.m. Please note that no siblings or other relatives are allowed into the building due to limited space in the classroom.

Student Drop-Off Procedures

School begins promptly at 8:45 a.m. Students will not be granted entry into the building prior to 8:30 a.m., regardless of the weather. All classes will be assigned to specific doors for entry. Parents and guardians are encouraged to plan and allow more time for student drop-off to ensure a prompt arrival at school. Your child's assigned drop-off door is noted below.

*To ensure the health and safety of all students and staff, it is imperative that you adhere to this procedure. Students attempting to enter through the incorrect door will be redirected to their assigned door.

Tardy Students

Please make every effort to arrive at school on time, as tardiness disrupts the educational process. Instruction begins promptly at 8:45 a.m. Any student who is not in their homeroom by 8:45 a.m. will be considered tardy.

*Tardy students must enter through Door #1 to obtain a tardy slip.

Student Dismissal Procedures

The school day concludes promptly at 3:20 p.m. All classes will be assigned to specific doors for dismissal. Students must exit the building with their class. Parents and guardians are being asked to have their children picked up immediately upon the conclusion of each school day. Please refrain from calling your child out of the line and allow the teacher to dismiss the students individually. This is also not the time to engage in conferences with the teacher as he/she needs to focus on dismissing the class.

To stress the importance of timely pickups, please understand that if you repeatedly fail to pick up your child(ren) accordingly, we will be forced to contact the appropriate and necessary authorities (i.e., Linden Police Department or DCP&P).

A dismissal form was emailed home; please fill it out and return it on the first day of school. This form will also be posted on the school's website. Additionally, please make sure your child's ***Note that your child will NOT be released to anyone NOT listed on the form. Any changes that need to be made must be done in writing.**

School Security

SCHOOL ENTRY PROTOCOL:

For the safety of our students and staff, the district has implemented a new school entry protocol. They are listed below for your reference.

- 1. All visitors to our schools will need to have an appointment (advanced notice) to enter the building.
- No visitors will be granted building access (unless they have a scheduled appointment) between the following times: 8:30 a.m. 9:00 a.m. and 3:05 p.m. 3:35 p.m.
- 3. Any parent/guardian, who needs to pick up a child early, must notify the office in writing/email prior to dismissal. If it is an emergency, the parent/guardian must call the office and notify the school.

- 4. If a visitor must drop off an item for a student (lunch, homework, etc.), they will be directed to deposit that item in a bin outside the main entry. All items must be clearly labeled with the student's name, grade, and teacher and will be retrieved by office staff. Entry into the school building is not permitted.
- 5. It is imperative that visitors do not hold the door open for others behind them. Each visitor must be acknowledged individually through the intercom system.
- 6. Through the intercom, all visitors must state the purpose of their visit and specify with whom they have an appointment before entering the building.
 - a) If the appointment is verified, the visitor will be buzzed in and immediately report directly to the main office or designated sign-in area.
 - b) All visitors will be required to show photo identification when signing into the building and to wear a visitor's pass while in the building.
 - c) Front-office secretaries must call 911 and notify school administrators if the visitor is uncooperative, does not adhere to the procedures, or becomes threatening.

7. Failure to follow these procedures may result in a lockdown for the safety of students and staff, and the Linden Police Department may be notified that an intruder is in the building.

You are still welcome in our schools but with parameters. Please try to schedule appointments to see a teacher or the principal. Of course, emergencies arise, but we intend that upon arrival, we can give you the proper attention and dedication your concern deserves while still upholding the integrity of our safety protocol.

*Large-scale events will adhere to the same protocol; however, specific guidelines will be communicated.

Birthday/Holiday Celebrations

We do not celebrate individual student birthday celebrations in school. Holiday classroom parties and PTA-sponsored events are permissible and will be handled separately.

Technology

All students in Pre-K through 5th grade have been provided with iPads. Pre-K and Kindergarten students will use their iPads in school. Students in 1-5 grade will take their iPads home. They are expected to return to school fully charged (with a charger) and ready to use the following day. Parents are STRONGLY encouraged to enroll in the district Tech Care accidental coverage program for the iPads. This will cover damages (cracked screens, water damage) that may occur. Otherwise, you will be responsible for paying the full cost. Please log on to www.myschoolbucks.com to create an account if you do not already have one. All payments for

Teacher Communication

Parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher via email, phone, or Class Dojo. Impromptu visits to the school to speak to your child's teacher will not be granted. A staff directory with email addresses is attached.

*For the health and safety of your child, it is EXTREMELY important that the Dismissal Permission Slip and Emergency Information Verification Form be completed and turned in on the First Day of School, Thursday, September 7th.
